PRIORITY CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS INCLUDE:

Alfred Nobel Hall of Science. Since 1962, the Nobel Hall of Science has stood on campus as a strong and steadfast reminder of the College's commitment to the sciences. However, changes are needed due to the steady increase of students interested in majoring in Biology, Biochemistry, Chemistry, Geography, and Geology and the diversification of teaching methods from primarily lecture to guided inquiry. Plans include renovating the current building, adding approximately 50,000 square feet, and updating technology/instrumentation. Anderson Social Science Center. Built in 1948, the Anderson Social Science Center has had a unique history at Gustavus. It originally housed the campus library and then the departments of Economics/Management, History, Political Science, Psychology, and Sociology/Anthropology. With the recent addition of the Warren & Donna Beck Academic Hall, those departments have now vacated the building.
