





Gustavus has long prepared its students to live out lives of service and leadership in their communities. Recognizing this tradition of excellence, the College merged four separate programs (the Center for Vocational Reflection, the Community Service Center, the Office of Church Relations, and the Career Center) to create the Center for Servant Leadership (CSL) in 2011.

Collectively, the CSL uses its many programs and resources to equip members of the Gustavus community to learn, live, and lead "from within" in ways that serve others and help to address the world's deep needs. By working with many other programs and offices across campus—including academic departments, the Chaplains' Office, International Education, the Diversity Center, and student organizations—CSL makes the most out of coordinating existing opportunities and developing new ways to help students find their greater calling in life.

Examples of CSL programming include course offerings, retreats, workshops, conferences, discussion groups, resource center, and areas for small-group conversation. The CSL also acts as a springboard for ideas as the College works to strengthen leadership development.
