ABSTRACT:

The Zamzam Survivors collection consists of a variety of ephemera documenting the ship's sinking and subsequent events. Included are personal accounts, scrapbooks, newsletters, reunion programs, clippings, and some published works on the incident.

HISTORICAL NOTE:

On 17 April 1941, the neutral Egyptian ship Zamzam, with 201 passengers and crew, among them 144 missionaries headed for mission fields in Africa, was attacked and sunk by a German raider. Of the 144 missionaries, 19 were Augustana missionaries and their children.
